



Archbishop of Turin, Cesare Nosiglia, visits “Avv. Giovanni Agnelli” plant in Grugliasco (Turin)

Today the Archbishop of Turin, Cesare Nosiglia, visited the “Avv. Giovanni Agnelli” plant in Grugliasco (Turin), which is the production site for the recently launched Maserati Quattroporte and the Maserati Ghibli, which is to be launched this Summer.

Touring the plant with the Archbishop were Fiat Chairman, John Elkann, and CEO, Sergio Marchionne.

During the visit, Monsignor Nosiglia had the opportunity to see the body shop and assembly lines for both models. At the end of his visit, he said that he had “wanted to demonstrate his support and appreciation for an industry that is vitally important for the region, as well as the Group’s ability to transform itself and maintain and create jobs.”

Fiat Group bought the Grugliasco plant in November 2009, which had been inactive since September 2006. Fiat has invested more than €1 billion to develop the two new models and refurbish the plant. The platform installed, adopting the principles of World Class Manufacturing, is modular and highly flexible with the potential to be used for other future models. The plant currently employs more than 950 people and has a production capacity of around 130 cars a day operating two shifts.
